Obituary

JASON THOMAS SMITH, JR. was born to Rev. and Mrs. Jason T. Smith, Sr., on August 22, 1941, in Chicago, Illinois.

He received his education at the Forrestville Elementary School and DuSable High School from which he graduated.

He next attended the Ray Vogue Art School and Wilson Junior College. He was a member of the Revival Center Church of God in Christ, pastored by his father, Rev. J. T. Smith.

In 1963, he was drafted into the U.S. Army and served as an Inventory Clerk in Germany. He later toured eleven foreign countries. He received an Honorable Discharge in 1965, and soon thereafter was employed by the Chicago State Teachers College, as Director of Security, Transportation and Inventory. He was loved by his employers, his staff and all his friends and co-workers.

He passed away on Thursday, February 8, 1968, at 11:30 A.M., as a result of injuries sustained in the Mickelberry explosion on Wednesday, February 7, 1968.

He leaves to mourn him, a mother and a father, 5 sisters, 1 brother, 5 nieces, 5 nephews, 5 aunts, 5 uncles, a host of relatives and friends.
